As an organization, our goal is to draw awareness to the narratives held internally (within the body) and how this connects to the wellbeing culturally throughout the greater Kalamazoo community. We deliver our services through a decolonized, decentralized, trauma informed and indigenized lens that reflects the unique cultural heritage and experiences through a multicultural lens including, LGBTQIA+ and BIPOC living in the greater Kalamazoo community. In order to disrupt systems and structures of oppression the paradigm of surviving must shift to thriving. In order to reduce black/BIPOC oppression, we need spaces that reduce stress and invite healing.

Therefore we achieve our goal and mission through our Enrichment Center, which offers movement classes, workshops in cultural humility, yoga, meditation, doula/perinatal services, in addition to facilitating a youth dance and drum collective. As an organization we have offered culturally relevant dance, healing arts and somatic awareness to our community for over 6 years.

Position Title: Birth Justice Manager

Location: Kalamazoo, Michigan

Reports To: Birth Justice Director

Position Type: Full Time onsite 40 hours a week with some travel

Position Purpose: This role is instrumental in supporting our Red Birth Green doula programs and Baby Cafe. As the Birth Justice Manager, you will lead and coordinate initiatives to ensure equitable access to quality maternal healthcare services. Collaborating closely with the Birth Justice Director, this position requires a strong sense of community responsibility and the ability to engage with youth, pregnant individuals, and families in a friendly and professional manner. Attention to detail, excellent administration, and communication skills are crucial. A flexible schedule is essential, as many programs and services occur after school, some early evenings, and occasionally on weekends.

Essential Functions:

1. Community Engagement:

- Develop and maintain relationships with community organizations, healthcare providers, and key stakeholders to understand unique needs and challenges related to birth justice.
- Organize community forums, workshops, and events to raise awareness about birth justice issues and gather input from affected communities.
- Support logistics and coordination of internal and external activities.

2. Program Development:

- Co-create, implement, collaborate, and manage birth justice programs and initiatives.
- o Effectively provide ongoing programmatic support.
- Support day-to-day activities of birth justice programming.
- Stay informed about local, state, and federal policies impacting maternal health outcomes.

3. Data Collection and Analysis:

- Manage and enter data accurately and efficiently.
- Collect and analyze data related to maternal health outcomes, utilizing the information to inform program development and advocate for evidence-based interventions.
- o Provide training and education on data-related matters.

4. Collaboration and Networking:

- Work collaboratively with other Managers, Directors, organizations, and agencies regionally and nationally to share best practices and coordinate efforts.
- Work closely with the staff, interns, and volunteers to achieve Rootead's mission and uplift Rootead's values.
- Attend conferences, workshops, and seminars to stay abreast of developments in the field of birth justice.
- Effectively manages multiple projects and deadlines with input from various team members.

5. Leadership and Supervision:

- Provide effective leadership and supervision to the team and doulas responsible for birth justice initiatives, ensuring a positive working environment.
- Foster professional development among team and doula collective members, identifying training opportunities and supporting career growth.

6. Communication and Documentation:

- Demonstrate proficiency in Microsoft Suite and client management software (edoula.biz).
- Manage client data, contractor relationships, and program promotion activities.
- Ensure effective communication and documentation within the team and with external stakeholders.

Education/Work Experience:

- High school diploma or equivalent.
- 3-5 years experience in management.
- Managing many people of different levels of learning and experience.
- Experience in the coordination of people, paperwork, and timelines.
- Experience in community organizing, program development, or advocacy, with a focus on maternal healthcare.
- Highly effective communication and interpersonal skills.
- Proficient in task prioritization and effective time management.
- Ability to provide support tailored to the unique needs of diverse individuals.
- An abundant mindset and understanding of decolonization.
- Adaptable and open mind/heart.
- Anti-racist lens/training.

Work Environment/Physical Requirements:

Routine office environment; day-to-day work includes desk and personal computer work and interaction with and supporting staff. Must be able to lift 25 pounds. Must have reliable transportation, a valid driver's license, vehicle insurance that meets the state's requirements, and be able and willing to travel 20%-40% of the time as needed.
