Birth Justice

In the past fiscal year Birth Justice has:

» Increased Village Playdates weekly attendance from 1-5 families at the beginning of the year to 6-8 families at the end of the year

» Increased the number of doula clients from 30 individuals for FY22-23 to 50 individuals FY23-24

» 90% of clients were BIPOC

» 96% of clients received full scholarships for doula care



In the past fiscal year Community Healing has:

» Launched new initiatives including; Speak Freely Fridays, Hip Hop Kettlebell, Community Yoga, Somatic Movement with Kama, Grief Circles, and West African Dance with Heather.



» Roots of Liberation: 10 cohort members with 90% of them being BIPOC

Youth Enrichment

In the past fiscal year Youth Enrichment has:

- » RIY: Rootead In Youth served an average of 16 families each of the three, 6-week sessions.
- » RYDDE: Season 6 of Rootead Youth Drum & Dance Ensemble has grown to 21 dancers and drummers. They had sixteen community performances including The Doo-Dah Parade, RAD Fest, and Kalamazoo Foodways Symposium. Their biggest performances were Milwood International Night and the RYDDE Winter Showcase.
- » RYA: Rootead Youth Ambassadors launched and has nine participants.
